REMINDERS!

All Foundation Phase pupils (Grade 1 to 3) must leave the school premises after school dressed in their school uniform with shoes and socks on their feet. No parents/drivers/ lift club directors or any other persons are permitted to leave their vehicles at all and walk around the school premises in search of children. Please phone the school office if your child has not arrived at the arranged time to be collected and she/he will be located. Please adhere strictly to the drop-off and collection times.

Hair: Please make sure that your children's hair is neat, controlled, and appropriate for a young active child who needs to move a lot, go swimming, and wear a hat. Boys hair should be short and without fancy hairstyles and girls with long hair must tie their hair up and not have it hanging in their face.

Earrings: Girls with pierced ears may only wear plain gold or silver studs. No glittery diamante, pearl or hanging earrings are permitted to be worn with our school uniform.

Hygiene: Please remember that your child must wear a clean mask to school every day. It is recommended that a spare mask is carried in your child's school bag. Please assist your child to exercise proper hygiene and make sure that his/her fingernails are always kept short.
